

Botswana beauty wins crown

A FITTING finale for the World Supermodel pageant as the rain held and the beautiful Miss Botswana, Nature Inger was crowned winner on Saturday night.

Australian Vivienne Barclay was runner-up to Miss World Supermodel. She also won the best night gown category.

South African teenager Dane Venter won the swimwear category while England's Fiona Andrew was Miss Congeniality and Welsh beauty Emma Franklin was Miss Photogenic.
